

FAQ'S Peru Mission Trip \$1200

What does the cost cover?

In short, it covers everything! All transportation, including airfare, as well as food and lodging, are covered. We suggest bringing a small amount of cash for any souvenir shopping you would like to take part in, but everything else is covered.

How can I raise money to cover the trip cost?

If you don't have the resources to pay for your trip outright, you're not alone! Most people who journey with us have relied on the generous support of others to some degree to help them finance their trips. The method that we find to be most effective is writing and distributing support letters to family, friends, and coworkers. This connects them to your story and journey in such a compelling way. A sample letter is given upon request.

What kind of accommodations can I expect?

This will vary a bit but can expect to be well taken care of everywhere that we go. Particularly in more remote areas, there might be occasional inconveniences such as power outages, no A/C, thankfully we will have hot water for showers, and you can always expect a bed, plenty of delicious food and the best of hospitality. We can say with confidence that the life change that you will surely experience is well worth any potential discomfort!

What immunizations will I need?

For all the international locations, the CDC recommends, but does not require, Hepatitis A and B, Typhoid, and an updated Tetanus shot. For Peru specifically, your prescriptions medicines if any, travelers' diarrhea antibiotic, altitude sickness medicine, medicine to prevent malaria recommended for all mission trips. Many of these will be on site medication that can be prescribed if needed at the medical clinic.

Do I have to have any special skills or experience?

No! Our trips are for everyone. While some of our trips have specific objectives (such as medical clinics in Peru), we can use people from all walks of life on every trip.

How are participants prepared before going on trips?

We hold one training before each trip where we discuss how to be physically, mentally, emotionally, and spiritually prepared before the journey. We do everything we can to ensure everyone is as prepared as possible before departure!

How do I sign up for a trip?

What work will I be doing?

This will vary once on ground level, in Pedrigal Peru. Our vision for our team is to allow our partners on the ground to lead the way in planning our itineraries. Each location has projects that are ongoing that we can expect to plug into, such as medical services, translator, evangelism, and farmer field workshops to name a few. There are also short-term needs that our location will have, such as minor construction projects or painting, that we will plug into. We also will spend time loving on and praying with families in the communities that we work in. You can also expect to have a lot of fun!

Is it safe?

While there are always risks involved in international travel, we do everything in our power to ensure the safety of every trip member. Our in- country partners are like family to us; they have our safety in mind during every step of the trip planning process, as well as while we're on the ground. We always travel with local leaders who know the in's and out's of the communities we work in, and we provide practical tips on travel safety during our training.
